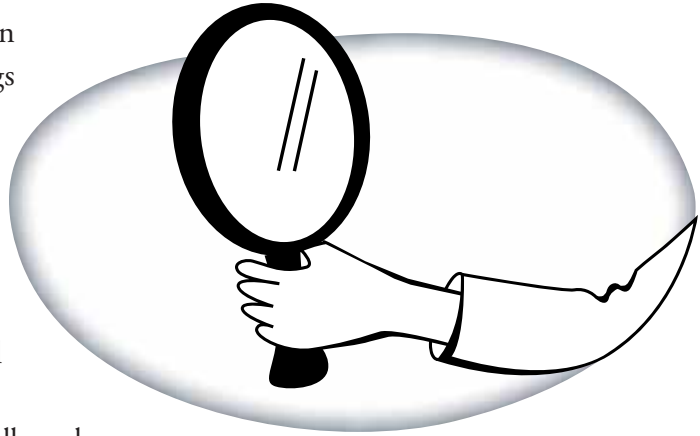


Can It Reflect Light?
